



WHAT ABOUT DISASTER Jingham URGENT RELIEF

· We have limited agencies in our network who are listed as EROs. SecondBite has noticed that many of these EROs prefer vouchers. However in an emergency situation such as after an extreme weather event, local stores may not be open or if they are, supplies may be very limited, meaning vouchers may not aid people in need, especially directly after a disaster has occurred. Additionally, emergency situations can happen at any time across Australia. SecondBite may not have an ERO listed agency with the correct infrastructure able to receive actual food items for their community. SecondBite would invite further discussion with the Department, on how this limitation is affecting communities in need of food support and what might be done to improve this process in the future.


